"Recognizing that legal aid is an essential element of a functioning criminal justice system that is based on the rule of law, a foundation for the enjoyment of other rights, including the right to a fair trial, and an important safeguard that ensures fundamental fairness and public trust in the criminal justice process, States should guarantee the right to legal aid in their national legal systems at the highest possible level (..).

> United Nations Principles and Guidelines on Access to Legal Aid in Criminal Justice System, 3 October 2012.

Minimum international legal standards on the right to legal aid have been set by the European Convention on Human Rights and the case law of the European Court of Human Rights, supported by principles and standards from the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, the UN Human Rights Committee, the UN Principles and Guidelines on Access to Legal Aid in Criminal Justice Systems, and other European and UN bodies.

One of the (most) fundamental procedural rights of all people accused or suspected of crimes is the right to legal assistance at all stages of the criminal process.

But it is not enough to merely allow a theoretical or illusory right to legal assistance. The right must be practical and effective in the way in which it is applied: the experience shows how far we are from fulfilling the (minimum) conditions.
